

Our math scores are noticeably low for all age groups in this area. Math is an area that our teachers will be working intensely with the children which will be noted in our comparison data at our winter checkpoint.

PROGRAM ACTION PLAN

In Social Emotional area, we will be providing “Do You S.E.A. What I See?” a social emotional curriculum created by one of our Yeled V’Yalda teachers to all sites. With the new HS Early Learning Outcomes Framework, we will be providing training in the Social Emotional domain targeting relationships with adults and other children. Moreover, we will provide articles to support further growth in this area. Our Mental Health Consultant will do classroom observations to assist teachers in promoting growth of social emotional skills.

In math, we will be focusing on improving scores by providing training and professional development in the counting, measurements and patterning objectives. In addition, we will provide copies of the High Five Mathematize that target these area.
